Ramblings Jesus says plainly "What I command you is to love one another." This can seem odd since that is what we want to do anyway: to love others and to love God. The command implies that this is so important it is key to life and how we live that life. What is so uplifting and reassuring in the Gospel is that we are called friends - friends of Jesus. Society once believed that love of friends was possibly the single most important thing in a person's life and they fact. Throughout celebrated the history, discourses and sermons have been written in praise of friendship. Jesus reminds us that God made friendship and that he chose his disciple to be his special friends. Friendship is not "mere" friendship, not a second-best; still less is it a repressed substitute for erotic love. It is a love in its own right, powerful, holy, overwhelming and all embracing. A world with Eros but without friendship is a world full of isolated, self-obsessed couples, of love unshared - a sad thing indeed. Let us foster friendship. Let us accept it as a true and passionate gift of God. Let us accept it in others without reading anything else into it. Let us rejoice if it is given to us and be glad if it is given to others. Jonathan loved David not because of what he could get out of him, but because he was David: let us celebrate this motiveless love of others. It is an echo of the pure love of Heaven. We not only ought to love everyone like that but we want to love everyone like that.
