**Ramblings** One of the first things we are taught about God is that God is Love. Love is of the essence of God who is the source of all love. Yet, when asked what Love is, do we ever begin by thinking that the Trinity is the best expression and offers the best understanding of love? We believe God is a community of three - Father, Son and Spirit. So is Love. Love is a community. The subject, the object and the interaction that brings them together, surrounds them and nurtures the relationship between them while emanating from them. Jesus came to live among us so that we could feel, experience and interact with God's love first hand. Jesus is the greatest expression of the love the Father could show us. and the Spirit binds and nurtures that love we have with him and with each other. In all the celebrations beginning with Advent through Christmas, Lent, Easter and Pentecost, the powerful and underlying theme is LOVE. The Love of God for us evokes and deepens our love for God and for each other and is brought about by the power of the Spirit. "God is love," scripture says, "and whoever abides in love abides in God and God abides in him or her." On reflection, love underlined and ran through the whole time of the Pandemic: Love for our families, for the sick, for those who have tragically died. Love has driven our selfless support of those in need, expressed so generously by the NHS. The suffering of those forced into isolation, cut off from family and the community has taught us the value and need we have for each other. To all those we have supported and helped, we owe a deep debt of gratitude for bringing out the best in us and revealing the power of love we have within. All this and much more, the Holy Trinity - Father, Son and Spirit - celebrate with us this day and every day.
