

Plan for the future

After discussions in the Pastoral team there will be some changes taking place in the church over the coming weeks.

We are asked by the Bishops to continue to provide hand sanitizer and face coverings are strongly recommended to be worn in church. We will continue with daily fogging of the church and other cleaning required when necessary. We will continue to have every other pew blocked off but from next weekend there will be no divide in the centre of the active pews and parishioners are asked to fill the pews from the middle and leave a socially distanced space between different households.

From 6pm Mass on 31st July the congregation will come out for communion. Starting from the front row to the back you will come out into the centre aisle and go up to the altar to receive communion and then return back to your pew via the far walls. The area around the font will come

Ramblings One of the freedoms allowed as we emerge from lockdown is the freedom to eat out together. Although food connoisseurs will write eloquently about food and ambiance, the real richness of eating out is the company, the conversation and being together. It is possible that the reason Jesus did not want to send the people off after feeding them was that he wanted them to talk about what they had experienced being with Jesus and listening to his teaching, while it was still fresh. Evidenced because, afterwards, they wanted to take him off and make him king. Fortunately, we know that Jesus is our king - a king who gives himself body and soul to us in the Eucharist, in the consecrated bread and wine that becomes his Body and Blood. It needs little effort to realise that we are of one mind. heart and soul, united by the Spirit in every Eucharistic meal. During the first lockdown, celebrating the Eucharist without people present made it extremely difficult to experience the presence of God. It became evidently clear how important your presence is in this meal and that communion really means being together. Preachers speak about love and truth, peace and goodness, the virtues and works of mercy, about the divinity and humanity of Christ and rightly so. But, without you, they are just words. You who are present (including those present virtually) make the words real because they are the lived experiences of your lives. Thoughts from the Assumptionist Rule of Life: The Reign of Jesus Christ for us and our neighbour takes place in our common life (parish). However diverse our works and activities we continue to share in the life and mission of the community(parish). Fraternal-life (parish) has to be built every day. Welcomed as a gift from God, it requires a daily conversion for each of us that strengthens our fidelity and that of our colleagues. Our love for God and humanity is up for communion after the two big banks of pews have finished. Initially the stewards will help with this movement until everyone is in the routine.

We also need to continue with the **track and trace system** so you are still required to use the QR code on the NHS app or sign in on the sheets for weekday Mass or be ticked off by the stewards for weekend Masses.

Sunday 5th September we will reintroduce the choir at the 10.30 Mass and congregational singing is permitted but face masks must be worn. There will be no singing at the 6pm or 8.30am Masses. Altar servers will be invited to have update training over the summer in preparation for their return to service in September.

We will also be writing to those groups who used to organise the coffee mornings after Mass to see if they would like to start up again in September.

All changes will be subject to the prevailing conditions locally for the virus.

Other items of interest

A group of young Christians (18-30s) are organising a Relay, walking from the G7 in Cornwall (13th June) to COP26 in Glasgow (1st November) for climate justice. People are joining the Relay from thousands of different churches all along the route. Walkers can be of all ages but to be one of the leaders you have to be under 30!

The Relay reaches London on 2nd August and Hertfordshire on 10th August. There will be overnight stops in the parishes of Ashford, Twickenham, Muswell Hill, Borehamwood, Hemel Hempstead and Tring.

Two events are beings hosted on behalf of the Diocese of Westminster in Central London on 6th August – a vegan lunch at Farm Street Church, Mayfair, at 1pm followed by a walk to Westminster Cathedral and an Ecumenical Climate Prayer Service at the Cathedral at 3.30pm.
