Ramblings We pick up the theme of Jesus, the Bread of Life. Jesus gives himself to us completely, body and blood, heart and soul. Thus, Christ becomes fully part of our life – body, mind and soul. With ordinary food and drink, we inevitably become hungry again. The presence of Jesus in our lives inspires us to reach out to others in need, share fully in the joys and sorrows of family life and in the life of others. Love, goodness, hope and trust abound in the process. Living this way, these gifts spill over into the lives of others and yet our capacity for all these gifts grows ever larger not less. However good the explanations, virtues are experienced, they are felt, and so, too, is God's presence. Giving ourselves away, we have always more to give. Becoming aware of God's presence, we discover God's presence everywhere! Apollus, response to God's presence:

You made the sun and the moon and all this with Love. You put the stars in the heavens and the clouds high above.

I see the mountains so high they stand in your name. I see the birds in the sky. I hear them sing

Man praises man for painting these things, yet it is because of God that every bird sings. Open your eyes and watch the dolphin dance upon the waves. Open your heart and know that our creator Jesus saves.

Watch a baby crawl. Hear a man laugh and sing. See a mother's tears of anguish and know that life is not a simple thing. To laugh, to cry, to feel, to see. I am truly amazed just to be.

To hear, to touch, to breathe, to sigh; a walking miracle from the one on high. As you live your lives no matter where, dancing or crying, always be aware. It's better to have lived than not at all. for this is your chance to hear the Masters call.

From 6pm Mass tomorrow on 31st July the congregation will come out for communion. Starting from the front row to the back you will come out into the centre aisle and go up to the altar to receive communion (in the hand only) and then return back to your pew via the far walls. The area around the font will come up for communion after the two big banks of pews have finished. Initially the stewards will help with this movement until everyone is in the routine.

We also need to continue with the track and trace system so you are still required to use the QR code on the NHS app or sign in on the sheets for weekday Mass or be ticked off by the stewards for weekend Masses.


