Parish Prayer: Lord Jesus, as the world copes with coronavirus, help us to remember that you are always with us. Grant wisdom to decision makers and bless all health workers. Bring healing to the sick; give peace to the anxious and comfort those who are sad. Stir us to show your love and mercy most especially to the poor and weak. This we ask in your name. Amen.

Ramblings We are reminded once again that Jesus is the Bread of Life, making us increasingly aware of the importance of the Eucharist. Although controversial for some, we speak about the *real presence* of Jesus in the Eucharist. This has been the subject of great debate throughout history. Philosophical and theological language have been used to seek a clearer understanding. In the past when the register was called in school, you answered "Present!" This was never the subject of debate because you were either or you weren't! Sometimes conversations when the one speaking goes on too long, your mind wanders. You are no longer present to the person speaking. This can happen in a lecture and even in our prayer. When two people are in love, there are times when words are no longer necessary - being physically present to each other is enough - while being apart is painful. When Jesus returned to his Father at the ascension, he said he would be with us always until the end of time. One of the ways he chose to be with us is in the Eucharist in which Jesus is physically present. In the Eucharist we can touch and consume Jesus who then becomes fully part of us. True love needs physical presence which is why we celebrate the Eucharist every day. It offers us the opportunity to spend time with the one we love and who loves us. As we do this, we become aware that Jesus is not only present in the Eucharist but in each of us. In fact, we discover Jesus is in everyone. It is a felt presence that we take away with us and enables us to experience and reveal that presence in others and, of course, in creation itself. We so need the Eucharist to remind us of that divine presence within us which it stimulates and strengthens.

The specific vocation of the Church evangelization, which isn't proselytism, no. Its vocation is evangelization; even more, the Church's identity is evangelization.

We can only renew the Church by discerning God's will in our daily life and embarking on a transformation guided by the Holy Spirit. Our own reform as persons is that transformation. Allowing the Holy Spirit, the gift of God in our hearts, remind us what Jesus taught and help us put it into practice.

Let us begin reforming the Church with a reform of ourselves, without prefabricated ideas, without ideological prejudices, without rigidity, but rather by moving forward based on spiritual experience -an experience of prayer, an experience of charity, an experience of service.

I dream of an even more missionary option: one that goes out to meet others without proselytism and that transforms all its structures for the evangelization of today's world.

Let us remember that the Church always has difficulties, always is in crisis, because she's alive. Living things go through crises. Only the dead don't have crises.

Let us pray for the Church, that she may receive from the Holy Spirit the grace and strength to reform herself in the light of the Gospel.
