

Ramblings Our founder Emmanuel d'Alzon named the Congregation he founded the Augustinians of the Assumption. He acquired a school called Assumption College in Nimes and named his newly founded congregation after the Assumption, in 1845. This was well before the Assumption was declared a Dogma of the Church. Emmanuel added Augustine to our name because he adopted the rule of St Augustine known as the Rule of Love. It is with great joy and with a sense of high privilege that we celebrate the feast of the Assumption each year. What better friend and patron to have than Our Blessed Lady, Mary the Mother of God? As our model, she fills our souls with delight, lifts us up when we are feeing down, helps and cares for our wounds, and brings us back whenever we take a wrong turn. Mary is always there, always smiling, always exuding a warmth that reassures and comforts. Yet, she challenges and motivates us to do better, to be more trusting in her Son, more courageous in our actions; more loyal, more generous, more passionate in nurturing and spreading the kingdom of God. Initially it would be good if we could get teams of 2-3 people to do Saturday from 8.30-9.30 so it is ready for 10am Mass. Ideally we want 4-5 teams of people so every Saturday is covered and every team only needs to do once a month.

Update on Sr Anne-Marie from the Mother house. Anne - Marie is not doing so well since she has gone through 2 bereavements: a sister

and a niece. This affected her very much. Then she fell and broke her neck of the femur. She had to be operated on at Redon hospital where she contracted COVID despite her vaccination. She was transferred to Rennes to Pôle St Hélier for rehabilitation where she began with isolation. I don't think the disease manifested in a complicated way, but not seeing contributed to some loneliness. Having had no visits, she now finds it difficult to locate herself in reality and the confusion still prevails. There is a sister from Rennes who can now visit her.
