Parish Prayer: Lord Jesus, as the world copes with coronavirus, help us to remember that you are always with us. Grant wisdom to decision makers and bless all health workers. **Ramblings** The blind see, the deaf hear and the dumb speak, no wonder the people were astounded at Jesus. However, there is also spiritual blindness, spiritual deafness and spiritual dumbness. Through Baptism Jesus gave us power to heal people of these spiritual ailments, but in order for this to happen, we need to recognise our own spiritual blindness, spiritual deafness and spiritual dumbness. Our difficulty, however, is not always being aware of how or when we heal others, or how God uses his power to work through us. For too long, even before the pandemic, we have been blind, deaf and dumb about the harm we have inflicted on creation which has led to an increase in the severe weather conditions we are experiencing today. These will only increase and be more devastating in the future. Laudato Si the encyclical on ecology and creation was published in June 2015 and we have been playing around pretending to do something for 6 years. Because of our blindness, deafness and dumbness, we are only just beginning to wake up to the fact that it might already be too late. If we are, then we will be responsible for killing **billions** of people because we have taken away their future. We need to take radical steps now, like Nineveh's response to the call of Jonah to repent and be saved by God.

"Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs". Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her...This is why the earth herself, burdened and
