**Ramblings** Pope Francis begins his message for the 107<sup>th</sup> World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees with: In the Encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, I expressed a concern and a hope that remain uppermost in my thoughts: *“Once this health crisis passes, our worst response would be to plunge even more deeply into feverish consumerism and new forms of egotistic self-preservation. God willing, after all this, we will think no longer in terms of ‘them’ and ‘those’, but only ‘us’”* (No. 35). This makes us a very big family, very many of whom we have never met . . . We are learning - too slowly - that many of the issues we face today can only be met by joining with others. This became apparent in the initial divisions separating Christian denominations, most of which now work together, and everyone benefits. Different faiths also work together to resolve common challenges and all have been enriched. We have overcome obstacles that could not be moved alone. Welcoming Migrants and Refugees is welcoming a brother, a sister, a branch of the family. Welcomed not as a problem but as a strength. It is like welcoming a part of yourself that had been lost or mislaid and has now surfaced. **They help make us whole.** The theme *“Towards an ever wider we”* is an invitation for all of us to commit ourselves to restoring our human family. We are like many grains of sand, all of us are different and unique, but together we can form a beautiful beach, a true work of art! We are all in the same boat and we are called to commit ourselves so that no more walls separate us, so that there are no longer others but only one **we**; a we as wide as us, an us as great as all of humanity. (Bishop Mark Seitz). Helping a family across a border he adds: *I realised our destinies were somehow linked. It was no longer about us and them. I felt the presence of God, calling us to build a world*

#### **Recycling update**



Since the bins have been outside the recycling is picking up which is good for all the charities who are benefiting and for our environment as we recycle our waste. However we need to do our recycling responsibly with care for those who are spending time packaging all the items up to go to Terracycle for the money for the charities. Deolinda and Michael Eltringham spend hours preparing these recycled items because those of us donating them haven't spent a few minutes preparing the items suitably.

So we are featuring each item for us to rethink about how we prepare them before we bring them to the bins.

#### **Colgate Oral Care items:**

We are collecting All brands of: Toothpaste tubes and caps, Plastic Toothbrushes and outer packaging, Electric and



battery toothbrush HEADS only, Toothpaste cartons, and Floss containers and their outer packaging.

**Necessary preparation before you bring these items to the bin**

Please use scissors to cut open the toothpaste tubes and make sure all leftover product has been used and washed out, rinse and let them dry before bringing them to us.

**Please note, waste that is NOT accepted:**

- Inter-dental Brushes
- Battery Toothbrush handles
- Toothache Kits
- Mouthwash Plastic Bottles
- Denture Cream Tubes
- Breath Sprays
- Denture Adhesives or Tablets Packaging
- All tubes that did not contain toothpaste
- Outer packaging that did not contain toothbrushes
- Cartons that did not contain toothpaste
- Wooden toothbrushes

The Church of God is convoked in Synod. The path entitled **“For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission”** will solemnly open on the 9th – 10th of October 2021



in Rome and on the following 17th of October in each particular Church. One fundamental stage will be the celebration of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, in October 2023, which will be followed by the implementation phase that will again involve the particular Churches (cf. EC, arts. 19-21). With this convocation, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: “It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium.” This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church’s “renewal” proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our “journeying together” is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God.
