Normally we would celebrate All Saints today, instead we have the ferial readings.

Jesus challenges our hidden agendas for it is impossible to be truly open and transparent if you have a hidden agenda. Jesus won salvation for us and offers it to us with absolutely no strings, no conditions, no hidden agendas.

The question is do we live with the same sort of freedom helping, guiding, supporting others purely for their benefit and goodness? This is much more difficult. St Paul makes it clear that everything we do and are comes from God - everything. It is hoped that awareness of these challenges will be forcefully made at COP26. Globally, governments must be pushed to accelerate efforts towards net zero emissions and potentially limit the planet to 1.5 degrees warming. To achieve a sustainable future, we need to fix climate change, protect nature, reduce consumption and biodiversity loss.
