Ramblings The song for this Sunday as we light the pink candle is Gaudete! Gaudete! Rejoice! Reioice!

It seems that C.S. Lewis, in his Narnia books, says that creation was sung into existence. This Sunday suggests that the melody was one of rejoicing. Every morning the birds greet the new day with song. The Advent season offers us an opportunity to hear the Song of God in his creation in each other but most of all within ourselves.

"Take time to be aware that in the very midst of our busy preparations for the celebration of Christ's birth in ancient Bethlehem, Christ is reborn in the Bethlehem's of our homes and daily lives. Take time, slow down, be still, be awake to the Divine Mystery that looks so common and so ordinary yet is wondrously present.

An old abbot was fond of saying, 'The devil is always the most active on the highest feast days.' The supreme trick of Old Scratch is to have us be so busy decorating, preparing food, practicing music and cleaning in preparation for the feast of Christmas that we actually miss the coming of Christ. The Bishops have issued the following information regarding Covid Safety in our churches

With respect to the current situation with the omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in our churches:

- People displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.
- Hand sanitiser is available to those attending the Church and should be used on entrance and exit.
- It is now mandatory for people to wear a face covering (both nose and mouth) during the act of worship unless there is a genuine exemption.
- We maintain good ventilation and air throughput in the building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, please wrap up well in church!
- We encourage people to get vaccinated and have the booster jab when.
- People who are engaged in a form of pastoral ministry which involves ministry to the housebound, sick and vulnerable, should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so. These are free from the NHS.
