

**Ramblings** On a visit to India, I arrived with a fellow Assumptionist at a convent at 2.30 in the morning after a five-hour drive from the airport. The sisters greeted us by placing a spot of red powder on our foreheads and a wreath of flowers around our necks. When asked why, they said it was a Hindu custom that when strangers arrived at a house they were to be greeted like God's with honour, reverence and respect - a truly wonderful tradition. It helps us understand Elizabeth's greeting of Mary seeing her as a bearer of God. But each of us are God-bearers. We too should greet strangers with honour, reverence and respect because they are bearers of God, even if they do not know it. Similarly, we ourselves are God-bearers to those whom we visit. This is even more real for ministers of the Eucharist bringing communion to the sick and housebound. It is good to be reminded that we live the Gospel that we read every day.

"We are called to be God's witnesses by the love we extend to others; precursors of his justice by our unfailing commitment to what is right and good; lamps reflecting the light of Christ in our forgiveness, mercy and compassion; harvesters of souls through our humble and dedicated servanthood."

"A novice master, when asked about a life lived in Christian authenticity, said that to be a Christian was not to know the answers but to begin to live in the part of the self where the question is born.... He was speaking of an attitude of listening, of awareness of presence, of an openness to mystery." He could have been talking about our synodal sharing?

1. It would be good to get the church nicely

cleaned before Christmas, dusted, vacuumed and washed. We invite people to come at 11am on Thursday 23rd December. Please let Trish know if you can come. The more who come the quicker it will be.

- 2. We are compiling the new rota for fogging the church after every mass. It doesn't have to be done immediately after that Mass but certainly before the next service so there is some flexibility. We need people to fog each day after the 10am Mass and then after the 6pm on a Saturday evening, and after the 8.30am and 10.30am on a Sunday. It takes about 10 minutes and is very important to keep our parishioners safe. If you can help on a rota basis maybe once every 3-4 weeks please let me know asap which day(s) you can help on.
- 3. As more people are coming (Thank the Lord) the church is getting dirtier and we need to reinstate the Saturday morning cleaning from 8.30am 9.45am so that the church is fresh for our weekend services. This includes dusting, vacuuming and washing the porch floor in a team of ideally 3 people. Can you do this on a monthly basis? Let me know if you can.
