## Ramblings Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> January, The Baptism of Jesus, Year C 2022

It is a breath-taking jump from the visit of the Magi to the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan 30 years later. Assimilation is needed. This is partly why we leave the crib up until the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, 2<sup>nd</sup> February. The dates of these early celebrations were not fixed until the 4<sup>th</sup> Century. The early understanding of the Epiphany including all the early epiphanies (manifestations) of God in one celebration. The Nativity, the coming of the Magi manifesting Jesus as Messiah to the world, the Baptism of Jesus and the changing of the water into wine at the marriage in Cana. Water is a major theme at the birth, in the Baptism and in the marriage feast. In the early days all waters were blessed including rivers and seas because of its major functions of cleansing and giving life. Although clearer in some, these epiphanies manifested the presence of the Trinity but most especially in the Holy Spirit empowering Jesus for mission at his baptism. Jesus is presented to us as priest, prophet and king filled with the presence of the Father. Being made in God's image, in Baptism we become heirs to Jesus, his brothers and sisters, we are empowered to share in his mission to be good news for others. Jesus spent time in the desert to assimilate his mission to prepare himself for the challenges ahead. The Father and Spirit watched over him. We, too, need time to re-assimilate our baptism and prepare ourselves to enter a New Year accompanied by the Father and the Spirit to meet the unknown Challenges ahead and be people of Good News for 2022.

Lord, you make all things new.

You bring hope alive in our hearts and cause our Spirits to be born again.

Thank you for this new year, for all the potential it holds.


