Reflection Tuesday Week 1 – 2022

The name Samuel has two possible meaning: *The Name of God* or *God heard*. Either way the name could mean *Gift of God* since Hannah certainly saw it that way. God had taken away her embarrassment and she certainly saw Samuel as a gift. All life is a gift of God which this story makes very clear. It also makes clear that we do not possess people. Mary would eventually hand over her child, Jesus, to God but raised, nurtured and cared for him through his early life like all good mothers.

Jesus' desire to free people from the evil that had entrapped them was instilled in him by Mary and Joseph who had done the same for him – saving him from Herod and shielding him from harm. Jesus spoke with authority not only in the way that evil spirits obeyed him but in the way that people recognised the truth and power behind what he said. A truth that spoke of love, goodness and compassion, and a power that was uplifting, making his listeners feel valued and with honour and respect.
