Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Grant wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide those who have power over war and peace. Hold and protect your precious children, at risk and in fear. We pray in the name of Jesus, Prince of Peace. Amen.

Ramblings Everything about Jesus and his teaching is simple and straight forward; so why do we make it so complicated? St Paul suggests that knowing Jesus is what is important. Unfortunately, academics immediately think this is about knowledge and understanding, forgetting that knowing also refers to a relationship which is experiential. When people want to know us, we talk about our history, achievements, our work and what we have done, but that is not who we are even though it will colour how we are seen by others. Who I am concerns what makes me tick, what is important and of value, what motivates me and where I find fulfilment and most of all the influence and power of my faith in Jesus Christ that shapes my life. Relationships are nourishing, energising, motivating, inspiring; sources of joy and sorrow, of suffering and exultation, frustration and discovery. Relationships give flesh and blood to the importance and value of mystery which always guides us into something deeper and richer and shows us that there is so much more. The Scribes and Pharisees often played games with people's lives as they did with the woman caught in adultery. (It is impossible to commit adultery on your own!!) We only find faults in others that exist in ourselves in another guise. This is why not a single stone was thrown!! Being free from sin, Jesus does not see the faults in our lives only our goodness and our potential for love and sacrifice and care and kindness and . . .! No lectures about right or wrong or the evils of adultery were given, just a simple request Go and sin no more!! Jesus sends the woman forth trusting and believing she would do just that. And Jesus forgives us our faults with the same love and trust he showed that woman. Telling us to Go and sin no more! Surely that is someone with whom you would want a relationship??

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week. We will have blessing of palms at all Masses in the garden (if the

weather is inclement it will be in the hall) On arrival to church please collect your palms and be in place in the garden at the start time of the Mass ie 6pm, 8.30am or 10.30am.

There will be children's liturgy in the hall at the 10.30 Mass for all ages, children age 5 and under

should be accompanied by a parent. We will return to the church just before the offertory and the children will take the gifts up on this occasion.



Monday 11th April 7.30pm Passover Meal in the Church Hall. There are only 6 spaces left as we are limiting numbers to 60 people. To celebrate Passover is

to do what Jesus did with his disciples at the Last Supper. It is a chance for us to understand more deeply our Jewish roots and our Christian Eucharist. The Passover Meal is a family occasion and children form an integral part of the proceedings, so all are very welcome.

You need to bring a number of things with you: a baked potato for each person, cooked and wrapped in foil (to keep warm), sufficient wine for 4 toasts, soft drinks/water, cutlery, plates and glasses for each person. Roast lamb is provided. (You can bring salad and toppings for the potatoes as well – to share with those around you, if you wish.)

The collection on Good Friday goes for the support of the beleaguered Church in the Holy Land. Giving to this is a visible sign of our support to those who live the Christian faith in difficult circumstances in the land of its birth.
