Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Grant wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide those who have power over war and peace. Hold and protect your precious children, at risk and in fear. We pray in the name of Jesus, Prince of Peace, Amen.

Ramblings Reading about the healings in the Acts is why we call this Divine Mercy Sunday. It is through the mercy of God that we are healed both spiritually and physically. It is only through the mercy of God that peace will ever return to Ukraine and overcome all the other wars in the world. Like Thomas, we are asked to believe in what might seem to be impossible, way beyond reason, unreal, and yet we do that in other ways all the time. We tell people we love them we hold them tenderly, we do and say many things to show our love for another, for others, but love is far greater than all that. Experiencing God's love for us is an even greater challenge. Fortunately, God helps us by showing us that it is an experience far beyond words.

The story of St Christopher states that, in his youth, Christopher was gifted in every way except faith. A big man, physically powerful, strong, goodhearted, mellow, and well-liked. He was generous, using his strength to help others. Yet he found it hard to believe in God. For him, the physical was real and everything else seemed unreal. He yearned to believe in God and deeply respected those who did. So, he lived as an honest agnostic, unable to believe in anything he could not physically see, feel, and touch. Yet he loved using his gifts, especially his strength, to serve others. He became a ferryboat operator helping to carry people across a dangerous river. One night, so the legend goes, during a storm, the ferryboat capsized and Christopher plunged into the dark waters to rescue a young child. Carrying that child to the shore, he looked into its face and saw there the face of Christ. After that he believed, for he had seen the face of Christ. The very name, Christopher means Christ-Bearer. Your name may not be Christopher but you are a 'Christbearer!'
