Reflection Easter Monday 2022

The psalmist says: Lord, you will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, at your right-hand happiness for ever. Having lied to frame Jesus and have him put to death, the Jewish leaders now produce another lie to cover up his resurrection. This is not the path we wish to take but, in recognising Jesus as the light, we seek his guidance in following the right path that recognises and values people and opens them to the Light that brings Life. If we experience new life and hope for the future, despite the difficult realties we face at present, this is far from true for the Ukrainian people who continue to suffer inhumane suffering and brutality. Whenever we reach out to those struggling to survive in our local communities because of lack of food or the ability to pay for utilities, we help increase hope in the world, a hope that may offer strength to the Ukrainian people in their struggle to survive.
