Ramblings We often talk about the glory of God or about giving glory to God but do we pause to think about what this really means? It is easy enough to say the words but glory must be more than that. How do you understand glory? Ronald Rolheiser links the glory of God with how God reveals himself to us as a God who is abounding in compassion, full of forgiveness, and awash with graciousness. God's glory is expressed in the way he cares for and watches over us and the best way we can give glory to God, as Jesus showed, is to emulate these qualities and allow the glory of God to work through us by showing compassion, by forgiving and by being gracious to all those we encounter. This helps us understand the words of Jesus 'Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified. If God has been glorified in him, God will in turn glorify him in himself, and will glorify him very soon.' God shares everything that he is with us, even his glory. This is what led Jesus to the Cross and was fulfilled in his resurrection. Yet, God's glory is never diminished and finds its best expression in God's love for us. It was the love between the Father and the Son that is the source of God's glory.

True love takes us to higher level – the level of the divine, as the following poem suggests:

Time is slow for too those who wait. Time is too fast for those who fear. Time is too long for those who mourn. Time is short for rejoice. too those who But for those who love. time is eternity. Henry van Dyke?

The Flower Arranging group had a great coffee morning on Sunday. It was so good to see so many people and there was a lovely atmosphere in the hall. With the cake, preserves and plant stall, they raised an amazing £144.88. So the flower fund has been replenished, everyone was so generous.

Thank you to everyone who came and supported them.

Also many thanks to all those who supported the Our Lady's Special Support Group coffee morning. £77 was raised. This weekend proceeds from the One World/Live Simply coffee morning will go to help the local charity, 'Herts Young Homeless'. Cakes, preserves and religious cards will also be on sale.

Offertory Collections taken during Mass will be resumed but given that the pandemic is very much still a risk, "passing the plate" during Mass will be delayed. For the time being, a "retiring" collection using baskets will be re-introduced as Parishioners exit the Church.

PARISH FINANCES The Annual Financial Return for the year ending 31 December 2021 has now been completed, signed-off by Fr Tom and sent to the Diocese. The Return shows an operating deficit of £10.522 for the year, which was due almost entirely to the loss of Offertory and Hall Rental income during the COVID Pandemic. The situation is starting to improve and we hope to be able to return to a more "balanced budget" position fairly soon but the anticipated increase in energy costs later this year will continue to put pressure on the Parish finances and it will be necessary to maintain tight control of expenditure, resume taking Offertory collections and promote Hall rentals. We have some good recycling news to share with the parish! Coffee refill bags can be recycled via Terracycle again! Having started long ago with Kenco collecting all coffee bands of refill bags, then adding Tassimo, it became very popular. We can collect the coffee refill bags again for recycling - this time sponsored by TAYLORS! Please note this is for coffee only, not teas. We have been approved to collect: all brands of ground coffee pouches, all brands of flexible coffee packaging, and all brands of coffee bean pouches. No glass jars, no metal tins, no hard plastic lids or containers, and NO pods at all!

We hope parishioners will support this waste stream collection as before as it will help replace some of the fundraising for Phase that we lost.
