Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Grant wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide those who have power over war and peace. Hold and protect your precious children, at risk and in fear. We pray in the name of Jesus, Prince of Peace. Ramblings The challenge concerning circumcision and being a Christian in the first reading reminds us of a continual challenge, namely: Is salvation free or not? The response to this challenge can meet with contradictory responses and for good reason. Everybody believes that Jesus died and rose again to save us from the destructiveness of sin and an eternal death cut off from God. Jesus did this freely and offers salvation to us without condition - unless believing and accepting is a condition. In other words, the grace of God is free and for everyone without exception. The sacraments offered are not only free but God desires to fill us with their graces so as to help us find true fulfilment with God both in this life and the next. In its wisdom and love of the faithful, the Church has offered us programmes to help us understand better the graces God offers us so as to benefit more fully from the graces given. After all it makes no sense to give gifts without providing an understanding of how to use them and an awareness of their potential. The danger is these to turn programmes into tests that the candidates have to pass through in order to receive the gifts that God offers without condition! Children in Primary School would never have initially chosen to go there and initiation can be difficult for some but, very quickly, children discover the joys of learning and enjoy the experience and the friendships they make. They also learn how to benefit from the hard lessons of life they sometimes face. During the pandemic, when schools were closed, many children missed being with their friends and the joys only school can offer. The challenge this week, if you are prepared to accept it, is "What does salvation mean to you!" "What does being saved mean." These questions do not selfdestruct!!!




Mrs Sarah Snowball has been appointed as the new Head Teacher for Our Lady School as from 1st September 2022. We






The paradox of abundance Over 800 million people go hungry each day. Yet the world produces over 4 billion tonnes of food and we
