**Ramblings** Whenever we have visitors or visit people, we offer or receive something to eat and drink as a sign of hospitality, welcome and friendship. We celebrate special occasions with a meal or possibly a banquet for which much time and effort is given to the presentation, favour and healthiness of the food. By comparison, the eucharist is a simple affair with only bread and wine, but this meal, which takes place with Jesus, present in both bread and wine, is about presence and the sharing of goodness, love, mercy and blessing. Being in the presence of Jesus is lifegiving, uplifting and sustaining because sharing a meal with Jesus and with others increases the presence of God within us in a more rounded way because it unites us (communion) and strengthens us as a family of friends and believers.

Pope Francis says: A blessing releases a cascade of goodness. To speak is to bless. Everything begins with blessing as words of goodness create a history of goodness. The act of blessing is a gift, since we are doing something for others, rather than ourselves. Blessing, is speaking with love and the Eucharist is itself a school of blessing. God blesses us, his beloved children, and encourages us to keep going, for we eat the Bread that contains all sweetness. Jesus gave the bread to the disciples in the multiplication of the loaves and fishes to feed several thousand people. Jesus trusts in the Father and those five loaves never run out, teaching his disciples to give, even if what we possess is limited. Whatever we have can bear fruit if we give it away. In the Eucharist, we find God contained in a piece of bread, inspiring us to give ourselves to others. The Lord comes to us in order to speak a blessing for us and to give us courage. He asks that we, too, be blessing and gift for others.


