Ramblings Chesterton once said "The way to love anything is to realize that it may be lost." He was speaking not only to us but to anyone who would listen. However, the quote is equally applicable to God. So as not to lose any of us, God sent his Son to guide us back to him. God will do anything to save us from harm and the feast of the Sacred Heart reminds us of that. We can also see in these words of Chesterton the infinite depth of God's love for us "To love means loving the unlovable. To forgive means pardoning the unpardonable. Faith means believing the unbelievable. Hope hoping means when everything seems hopeless." All shown in Jesus. The hardest of paradoxes is to accept that of handing over our lives fully to God. Yet, this is the only way for us to become fully free. By giving up our freedom like Elisha, we will become fully free. Elisha sacrificed his life and career by sacrificing the oxen and the plough - the tools necessary for his work - and becoming a servant of Elijah. In giving up his natural family he inherited a greater family: the people of God.

"According to most philosophers, God in making the world enslaved it. According to Christianity, in making it, He set it free. God had written, not so much a poem, but rather a play; a play he had planned as perfect, but which had necessarily been left to human actors and stage-managers, who had since made a great mess of it.". To choose to be truly free we must hand our lives completely over to God. The catch, which causes us the most fear and prevents us from doing it, is that we have to do it to find out!!

Other items of interest **Helping Herts Homeless update**

The Sanctuary has been providing 'move on' accommodation and support to homeless men, but is now in need of extensive modernisation.

The building is owned by Helping Herts Homeless (HHH), a registered charity operated by volunteers. Day-to-day services have been provided by a contractor, Haven First, who are withdrawing from their agreement with HHH at the end of 2022. With the building then otherwise due to lie empty, there is an opportunity to reconsider its purpose, and take radical action to determine its future.

The Board of Trustees of HHH met and made the decision to continue to operate the North Herts Sanctuary - subject to raising funds to redevelop it - so that it can be made fit for purpose. A project is now underway to establish what needs

to be done, how it can be done, and how to fund it. It will require a major fundraising campaign. The Hitchin community has always been generous in its support for the Sanctuary, and early indications are that this news will be widely welcomed.

In addition to operating the North Herts Sanctuary, HHH has increasingly been developing partnerships with other charities both elsewhere in Hitchin and more widely in Hertfordshire. addressing other aspects homelessness. The Board intends to build on this 'hub' role, sharing resources and collaborating with other related charities (which currently include award-winning Resolve, and the YMCA).

The Board of HHH is very pleased to announce that it has appointed Shelley Hugill as its Interim Chair. She will be both overseeing the building project, and introducing new ways of operating for the volunteers who work with HHH. This includes upgrading its use of technology, and improving its ability to communicate with all its stakeholders. It will mean that very shortly, better information will be available to enable all its supporters and volunteers to 'raise the game' in this important mission. A new leadership structure to carry HHH forward will be put in place, in due course.

Amongst these changes, it will become possible for people to register as 'Friends of Helping Herts Homeless'.

The changes to the building and to governance and operational structure, will be rolled out over the next 3-4 months. The speed at which this can proceed, will depend on HHH's ability to recruit additional volunteers who can offer some of their time, even if it is only a few hours a week, to implement them.
