Thomas Merton had a dream about a girl who called herself *Proverb*, who told him sadly that people did not give much thought to the book of Proverbs and rather disdained it. Sometime later Merton was walking through a shopping centre and as he looked at the people around him, he saw the girl *Proverb* present in everyone he encountered. Recognising the presence of the Spirit in others will urge us to treat with them honour, dignity and respect as bearers of God. Then, if we allow them, they will speak to us of God and change the way we see the world around us with all its challenges and abuses of power, injustices and cruelty. It will help us discover the immense love within people, their generosity, compassion and kindness, the overpowering goodness of people and thus be filled with hope.
