Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Ramblings Being greeted with the word 'Rejoice' as we are in the first reading brings sadness in the face of the many wars being waged in the world and especially in Ukraine. However, it is reassuring to be told that war, injustice, brutality and inhumanity are nothing to do with God and that God wants the complete opposite: for all people to live together in peace. To truly rejoice, we must make greater effort to create families and societies in which everyone is cared for, loved and valued. Words like reverence, dignity and honour should be in our thinking and in all our encounters. In creating us, God used these very same qualities as the stuff of which we are made. All too often we find that the people who are aggressive, brutal and abusive are people who have never been treated with reverence and respect. Without them they are unable to recognise their own dignity let alone the dignity of others.

If we do not take care of one another, starting with the least, with those who are most impacted, including creation, we cannot heal the world. Jesus proposes a life of service, of giving one's life for others. We want to recognize the human dignity in every person, whatever his or her race may be. Created in the image of God, the principle of the inalienable dignity of the person is best summed up in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which Saint John Paul II defined as a 'milestone on the long and difficult path of the human race.' Faith exhorts us to commit ourselves seriously and actively to combat indifference in the face of violations of human dignity; faith always requires us to let ourselves be healed and to convert from our individualism, both personal and collective. May the Lord restore our sight, enabling us to rediscover what it means to be members of the human family. **Pope Francis**
