Ramblings The prophet Micah wrote, "And what does the LORD require of you but to act justly, love kindly, and walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8). We are often encouraged to be humble, told the importance of humility but what does this really mean? Humble is derived from the Latin humus meaning earth. Other words linked with humility are submissive, respectful, lowly in manner, modest, not selfasserting, obedient. Humble people have their feet on the ground, live in the real world and recognise their place in it. Recognising their own strengths and weaknesses, they are able to recognise the strengths and weaknesses in others; that we are all in some way flawed. This develops a deep respect for oneself as a child of God but also for others. Jesus said treat others as you treat yourself. Words like demeaning, of little value, being less than others, or useless are completely contrary being to humble. Recognising that others are precious in the eyes of God means that we are also precious in God's eves!
