Macrina Wiederkehr: Beauty calls us to attention. It slows us down. . . It is difficult to hurry through beauty. Thomas Merton said, "Hurry ruins saints as well as poets and artists." If you are in a hurry, you probably won't stop to be present to "the beautiful." Beauty has the ability to heal life's wounds. It can make us receptive to grace.
