Ramblings The word of the wise says that putting God first, as Jesus asks of us, does not mean others do not matter. God as we know loves us all equally and without exception. In loving God, we will love what God loves and that includes everyone else. This implies that we do not possess or own our family but it does speak of a very special relationship with them unlike any other. Once again God sets the example. God gives us life, our abilities and talents, our virtues and qualities and above all freedom of choice. We come into the world able to love, to have faith and trust, and with the gift of hope; all of which we are able to strengthen or weaken according to the choices we make. But God does not interfere; God does not possess us. We choose God freely and lovingly. Scholars tell us that the word translated as hate in our gospel comes from a word meaning prefer. This suggests that making God our preferred choice, putting God first, actually strengthens the relationship we have with

The letter to Philemon helps bring out the importance of all these points. Onesimus has run away and by the law should be put to death. But, in Christ, Philemon and Onesimus are brothers, both loved unconditionally by Christ which implies they should also love each other unconditionally. Paul shows his trust in Philemon be sending Onesimus back to him, trusting him to do the right thing. History suggests Philemon did.
