Farewell to a much-loved Queen and Mother

It is no coincidence that Queen Elizabeth II died on the birthday of another Queen and Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Reflections on those who have died often teach us how much God has been present in them and how much they reflected the goodness, love and mercy of Jesus Christ. This is so true as we reflect on the life of Queen Elizabeth. She, among all the holy women who have died, also gives us a special and unique insight into the life and dedication of our other Queen and Mother, Mary.

Like Mary, Queen Elizabeth served this nation and the nations of peoples she loved with total selflessness and utter dedication, giving birth to Christ in our nation at every turning point, in times of happiness and joy as well as times of tragedy. sorrow and evil. Few can emulate commitment to service given not out of a sense of duty but out of a deep love for us. Would that our political leaders could find it in themselves to serve us with this same love and the desire to create a nation to be a living breathing family that cares for everyone especially the least, the marginalised and the neglected - a nation Queen Elizabeth strived to create. May our grief, our

deep sorrow and our tears be the seed-bed that grows a nation that Elizabeth wished us to be: united despite and even because of our differences; a nation that shows reverence, dignity and respect to all; a nation that works together to overcome difficulties, however great (like the ones we face today); a nation that rooted for and wanted the best for everyone without exception. In short, a nation of which Jesus Christ, himself, would be proud and in which Mary would truly rejoice!



Recycling for Charity

Raising funds for charity - Helping Herts Homeless (http://helpinghertshomeless.org.uk/)

1) BIC Spent Writing Instruments:

We are collecting: **All writing instruments can be** collected, regardless of their brand or material ballpoint pens, felt tips, mechanical pencils, markers, highlighters, fountain pens, correction tape or pens and correction fluid pots.

Wooden pencils and crayons can be collected for the educational charity **Diapalante**, active in Senegal and Mauritania (www.diapalante.org). (NO wax crayon pens accepted)

2) Colgate and Hello Oral Care recycling:

We are collecting All brands of: Toothpaste tubes and caps, Plastic Toothbrushes and outer packaging, Electric and battery toothbrush HEADS only. Toothpaste cartons, Floss containers and their outer packaging, and HELLO only mouthwash bottles and caps.

NB: In order to recycle this waste stream properly please use a scissors to cut open the toothpaste tubes and make sure all leftover product has been used and washed out, rinse and let them dry before bringing them to us.

Please note, waste **NOT** accepted:

• NO Inter-dental Brushes • NO Battery Toothbrush handles • NO Toothache Kits • NO wooden **toothbrushes** • NO Denture Cream Tubes • NO Breath Sprays • NO Denture Adhesives or Tablets Packaging • NO tubes and NO cartons that did not contain toothpaste • NO outer packaging that did not contain toothbrushes • NO other brands of Mouthwash **Plastic Bottles**

3) McVities Biscuits Wrappers Recycling: We are collecting: ALL brands of SWEET or Non-Savoury Biscuit wrappers and ALL brands Cake wrappers, and ALL brands Cracker Wrappers and **Bread Sticks.**

4) Warburtons Bakery and Wax Wrap recycling: We are collecting:

- All brands of plastic bread bags and closure tags.
- All brands of bakery plastic packaging (e.g.: trays, zipper bags, packs)

- 7) **RB® Hygiene Home Recycling:** We are collecting **flexible plastic packaging** from: stain remover powder packs, dishwashing tablets packs,

- dishwasher cleaner and fragrance packaging and plastic sleeves, home cleaning wipes, dishwasher salt bags, and foil inside dishwasher protector, cleaning products refill packaging. Please ensure all products residues have been rinsed from the packaging, before bringing them.
- 8) Marigold Gloves Recycling: We are collecting Marigold ONLY disposable and durable gloves from domestic use only, and their plastic packaging. (Waste NOT accepted: NO glove products that have been in contact with harsh/industrial chemicals, and NO other brands.)
- 9) GOOD Refill Pouch Recycling: We are collecting Shampoo refill pouches and lids from Head&Shoulders/Panene/Aussie/Herbal Essences ONLY. Please ensure all products residues have been rinsed from the packaging, before bringing them. (Waste NOT accepted: NO other brands and NO Rigid Shampoo bottles, that can be recycled through local council facilities).
