Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Grant wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide those who have power over war and peace. Hold and protect your precious children, at risk and in fear. We pray in the name of Jesus, Prince of Peace. Amen.

Ramblings It is no coincidence that one of the key questions asked at the conference I attended this past week was who is Jesus Christ for you? As we listen to the readings this week, it is very clear that it is not just any Jesus Christ but the Christ of the scriptures. Throughout his writing, St Paul emphasises this point again and again. Paul had a clear picture of this Christ, he was his Saviour, the one who turned his life upside down. the one who inspired and motivated him to preach the Gospel, the one who plucked him from death and suffering time after time, the one who gave him the courage to challenge Peter and the other apostles over circumcision.

The obvious follow-up question is how do we know that we have a correct image of Jesus as portrayed in the scriptures? Once again the readings have a simple answer: Through Prayer!! We acknowledge that Faith is a gift of God offered to us through Jesus Christ and planted within us by the Holy Spirit. Reflecting on this gift in prayer will lead us to its author. Prayer and faith are inseparable as Moses reminds us in the first reading and St Paul in the second. We can know our image of Christ is correct when it urges us to care for others especially those in need, to reach out to those on the margins: offering places to stay for Ukrainian refugees, providing food for the needy through Feedup Warmup, the Food Bank, My Pantry, offering a warm and welcoming place for people to gather through the coming winter months. In this way we respond to Paul's request to preach the Gospel by being artisans as well as bearers of Good News


Many thanks to you all for your very generous donations of £533.36 towards CAFOD's Harvest Fast Day Appeal last week.
