Ramblings

Not many leaders, if any, will talk about destruction, betrayal and rejection if you choose to follow them. Jesus did. When Luke wrote his gospel the temple had already been destroyed and Jerusalem raised to the ground.

Fortunately (or unfortunately) the Gospel could not be more apt for us today. Creation is crumbling around us. with fires. floods. earthquakes, starvation, migration. The eco system is gradually being eroded. It will not need the Romans to bring about destruction, we are doing it ourselves. The bible tells us that God has come to our aide and healed the destruction we have caused. God could do the same for us but we have to show that we are doing everything in our power not to waste our utilities, are reaching out to those in need and are willing to go without to make this possible. Despite everything we have done to creation, it is still crying out to help us. It has the power and the will to renew itself and help create a better future for us if we provide it with the opportunity to do so. Like God its creator, Creation wants to give us life so let's help it!! Here is the news: the Earth is crying Here is the truth - our lives will change Here is God's will - for love and justice Here is the chance to read the signs.

As Jesus warned with loving stories as Jonah's awful news hit home as even ultimatum heals us truth breaks the chains we've made our own.

Truth threatens yet also gives access to blessings the stories always are diverse: hope truly exceeding hope's rational grounding

flows from our trust in God, love's source. So ears and eyes, and minds wide open are gates and portals for God's care.

So Jesus' teachings speak directly to lived experience; now, and here!


