Reflection Tuesday 1st Week Advent 2022

In writing about the Spirit, Isaiah reminds us of our confirmation when the Spirit came to us in a special way. Isaiah wrote that the Spirit is a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. All of which are essential for life and *Integrity*.
