## Reflection Wednesday Week 32 Dedication of Lateran Basilica 2022

The Lateran Basilica was built by Emperor Constantine on the Lateran Hill in Rome about 324. The dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World," the feast has been extended to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, "presides over the whole assembly of charity."

We have certainly been made aware of the importance of water this year and must thank God for the recent rains.
