Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Ramblings Advent: a time of waiting and hope; a time of expectation, of new birth, a time of Light. One would think that by now, after so many Advents, we would know how to wait and benefit from it even more than we have done before. Yet the business of life suggests otherwise.

Has offered us many lessons about waiting: a year or more for our first teeth, pregnancy lasting 9 months, 6 years of Primary and secondary education and three years of university. Four weeks of advent should be a walk in the park! The creative world has many more examples of the importance of waiting. We begin our fellowship with Christ and all his followers in Baptism which in the Greek means "dipping in a liquid." In Mediterranean antiquity, water, fire, and wind (or spirit) were viewed as liquids that could be poured upon or into people.

Maybe we should call John, **John the Dipper** who recognised the important symbolism of water, fire, wind-spirit. But he also understood that his symbolic dipping of repentant Israelites in warm water will eventually be replaced with a judgmental dipping by "him who is to come" in the liquid of "holy wind or spirit" and fire. Which is itself a new birth. Reflecting on our baptism through the short period of advent will help prepare ourselves for the renewed coming of Christ who wishes to bring peace to our world through us. In baptism we receive the light of Christ:

In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us; to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. (Lk 1:78-79)

Thank you for your help. Urgent appeal for help with Terracycle Recycling scheme mid-Dec 2022 to mid-Jan 2023

Deolinda and Michael Eltringham will be visiting family overseas over the 4 weeks from mid-Dec 2022 to mid-Jan 2023, and are appealing to parishioner to help cover that same period, in maintaining a Terracycle recycling service to the parish and the town, to ensure we can continue to raise funds for the chosen charities.



Up until Monday 12th Dec, we will be able provide the usual service. After that, to all supporters and contributors to this recycling scheme, if you can collect your separated waste at home, and keep it with you, and only bring it to the parish from the weekend of the 14/15 Jan 2023 onwards, that would be a great help and much appreciated.

We are also appealing for a couple of volunteers or so, to monitor the five Terracycle collection bins, so that they are emptied, the bin liners replaced, and the collected waste over the 4 weeks from mid-Dec 2022 to mid-Jan 2023 are stored in a safe dry space, until we get back, so it can be sorted, and sent for recycling. That way, we can avoid overwhelming the parish with waste delivered, and not lose its value for our chosen charities. Let's offer such a service as a Green loving present to the mother Earth and our community! And does anyone have lots of space in their garage for storage of the collected items?

Message from Bishop Paul - A decision has been made to close St Elizabeth's Adult Care Home in Much Hadham with effect from 30th November 2022. Understandably this decision has caused distress and anxiety among families of residents and residents themselves, many of whom have lived in St Elizabeth's for decades. You may have heard of this development particularly if any of your parishioners have relatives residing at St Elizabeth's. At the time of writing 69 of the 83 residents have found alternative accommodation. The School and College at St Elizabeth's will remain operational. There are vacancies on the Governing Bodies of the School and College. I would be grateful if you would insert a note in your weekly newsletter
