"Enlarge the space of your tent" (Isaiah 54:2) **Synod 2021 - 2024** a reminder

The Agency for Evangelization have sent us the Working Document Summary which is a summary of the Working Document for the Continental Stage (DCS) which came from the Synod Office in the Vatican; The summary (attached) is a third of the length of the original. Both documents can be found on this link: https://rcdow.org.uk/synod/.

The Diocesan Discernment Group will be considering the following questions posed by the Vatican Synod Office at #106 of the Working Document for the Continental Stage:

- 1) "After having read and prayed with the DCS, which intuitions resonate most strongly with the lived experiences and realities of the Church in your continent? Which experiences are new, or illuminating to you?"
- 2) "After having read and prayed with the DCS, what substantial tensions or divergences emerge as particularly important in your continent's Consequently, perspective? what are questions or issues that should be addressed and considered in the next steps of the process?"
- 3) "Looking at what emerges from the previous two questions, what are the priorities, recurring themes and calls to action that can be shared with other local Churches around the world and discussed during the First Session of the Synodal Assembly in October 2023?"

No one has responded to the suggestion to have a meeting but if you have any responses to these questions please send them to Trish by 8th Jan so they can be sent to Adrian Cullen by the deadline of 9th Jan.

May the Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you: The Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace in 2023.
