Prayer for Ukraine: God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine; for peace and the laying down of weapons. Give comfort to those who fear for tomorrow. Grant wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide those who have power over war and peace. Hold and protect your precious children, at risk and in fear. We pray in the name of Jesus, Prince of Peace. Amen.

Ramblings Isaiah proclaims: Then your light will shine like the dawn – a new day. For Our light to shine Isaiah calls us to live the beatitudes we heard last week for they are the way of life for all who want to shine forth like a new day.

Paul tells us that we are who we are by the power of God, the power we received in baptism and Confirmation but we shine only when we let the power of God help and guide us in living the beatitudes. Both Light and Salt are transformative. They transform us from within and help others also to be transformed. Anthony de Mello describes this in the following story:

This is a dialogue between a recent convert and an unbelieving friend:

"So you have been converted to Christ?"
"Yes"

"Then you must know a great deal about him. Tell me: what country was he born in?"

"I don't know."

"What was his age when he died?" "I don't know." "How many sermons did he preach?" "I don't know."

"You certainly know very little for a man who claims to be converted to Christ."

"You are right. I am ashamed of how little I know about him. But this much I do know: Three years ago, I was a drunkard. I was in debt. My family was falling apart. My wife and children would dread my coming home each day.

Now I have given up drink; we are out of debt; ours is a happy home. All this Christ has done. This much I know of him!"

To really know Christ and to be Salt and Light we will be transformed by what we know and by how we live.
