Ramblings Listen carefully to the first reding from Ecclesiasticus this Sunday. It opens with these words: "If you choose, you can keep the commandments — they will save you. If you trust in God, you too shall live." They echo the words of the last of the five great opening books in the Jewish testament: I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Choose life, that you and your descendants may live, by loving the LORD, your God, heeding his voice, and holding fast to him. (Deut 30: 19-20)


We clearly have a choice about how we live our lives and have been given the wisdom and ability to make good, wholesome choices. For some, keeping the rules is paramount and when these are clear it can be straight forward but rules like loving God and loving neighbour raise the question of how? It is the question Jesus responds to in the Gospel. Jesus invites us to look for the spirit behind the rules or, as Deuteronomy implies, to choose life-giving responses. These responses however, can be far from easy and can involve suffering and heartbreak to which Jesus testified on the Cross. In fact, Jesus gave away his life so that we could all have life now and hereafter. Fulfilling the Law, which Jesus came to do, involves living its spirit which will affect the life of the whole community not just ourselves. The whole community, we are beginning to realise, is not just our Church but all Churches, people of all faiths and none, in fact the world community. But, equally important, is our creation.

This week we offer the sacrament of anointing of the sick asking God to bring healing to the members of our community so that they will be able to live healthier lives. We can offer help and healing to our creation by being less wasteful, living more simply and recycling. 




Annual Mass of Thanksgiving for the Sacrament of Matrimony
