**Ramblings** Being seized by the Spirit, as David was, being a light that illuminates others as St Paul tells us along with the blind man receiving his sight from Jesus, are powerful and uplifting themes this week. We call this Sunday **Laetare Sunday**, a day for rejoicing, to which these themes bear testimony. Although not often mentioned, joy is a major theme of Lent, we are preparing for Easter so that we will benefit more fully from the celebration of the resurrection of Christ. Joy changes the way we perceive everything. It helps us experience the goodness in others, all their positive attributes and to see their generosity and selflessness. Joy, like a light, shows up their true character of a person as a reflection of the character of Jesus. The real sadness of the Pharisees in the Gospel is their complete lack of Joy. Without joy they could not celebrate the fact that a man had been given back his sight and the joy that brought to all those he knew. We have been seized by the Spirit so that we might be a light for others and help them see the joy in those around them, the joy in their everyday experiences and encounters.

Let us think of God's mercy as a wet wipe and may it bring you JOY???

Liz Wills and her volunteers have been working hard to ensure all families have been visited, their children are kitted out with uniform and they can access Hitchin Pantry for food which they will cook in the hall kitchen throughout the week. I think we will need containers for them to transport the food back to their hotel. If you have any spare larger

plastic containers for cooked food to be transported can you please leave them in the porch in the same box as for the uniform.

### Hitchin Pantry Update

Total visits made by families/individuals since opening in Nov 2021 = 3421

There are 321 approved members registered on our database (only one person per household registers)

- 127 Those living in private rented
- 40 Those living in owner occupied/mortgage
- 5 Those living with a relative
- 110 Those living in social housing /local authority
- 4 Those rough sleeping/sofa surfing
- 18 Other
- Total 321**

- Current membership fee is £4.00 from the 1<sup>st</sup> April price increase to £5.50 to cover the increase in food costs
- Food donations are very low. The membership fees go straight back into buying food particularly meat & dairy which is very expensive
- Food is also collected by volunteers from the Parish from Fareshare, Felix Project, M&S, Aldi and Tescos – best before food and supermarket waste
- 14 new asylum-seeking families will be joining the Pantry next week, donations from local charities and parishioners will cover the cost of their membership fees. These new members will be using the church kitchen on a rota basis to cook their food.
- 18 current volunteers – 8 are parishioners

Love the Stranger is a new publication by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales' Department for International Affairs which articulates our Christian duty to look beyond labels and see the person who has left their homeland in search of a better life. In 2023, people making dangerous journeys across the Channel to reach the UK are called by various names: 'refugees', 'asylum seekers', 'migrants', and often by more derogatory terms.
