# **Ramblings** At the Easter Vigil the cantor sings: Oh, truly necessary sin of Adam, blotted out by the death of Christ!

O blessed fault, which won so great a redeemer! Some think that Jesus may not have come to live among us if sin had not entered into the world but did not Jesus also come because he wanted to teach us about the love the Father has for us? We did sin and Jesus came to redeem us through his death and resurrection. But Jesus also came to show us that God will not let sin and evil defeat him and that God can use something evil to create not only something good but something better.

The Easter Sequence makes clear: we gather together to offer a sacrifice of thanking and praise to Christ. We, the sheep, have been ransomed by the lamb of God, Jesus Christ. The innocent one has given his life to reconcile us and bring us back to the Father with love.

Tremendous grace flows from Jesus through his death and resurrection not only of forgiveness and mercy and love but with a desire to help and strengthen us to be his hands, his arms, his mouth and his ears in the world today. Together we make Jesus incarnate, he whose presence sustains, strengthens and promotes the silent goodness, kindness and compassion that pervades the world. When we seek the presence of the risen Christ this Sunday and we will, it will be found in the images of Jesus all around us.

23<sup>rd</sup> April 3pm at St Hugh of Lincoln Parish in Letchworth Fortescue Hall - screening of the movie **THE LETTER**, a documentary film by Emmy-winning director Nicolas Brown, released in October 2022 by the Laudato Si' Movement.
