Ramblings After the Ascension, the apostles and disciples spent much of their time in prayer. They had entered into another Advent Prayer, a waiting for God; in this case the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit who will return to renew our lives next week. Prayer is important in so many ways. One can think that the disciples were praying to be ready to receive the Spirit and recognise his(her) arrival when he comes. It would have been a prayer with many questions. What will happen? What kind of truth will be opened to me? Will I have the courage to respond? What is the best way to preach the Good News Jesus wants me to convey? I only speak one language? And many more. We now have a short time to reflect on what help, guidance, challenge, renewal and wisdom we hope the Holy Spirit will bring to each of us. John Henry Newman wrote a magnificent hymn to the Holy Spirit. Here is another one written by Bill Gathers:
