Ramblings Once the Spirit of God filled their lives, the apostles lost their fear and went out to people from many different nations gathering in Jerusalem for the feast of weeks, Shavuot. It was not that the apostles spoke different languages but that the listeners of different nationalities and languages were able to understand them. It was the listeners who were gifted with the ability to understand the apostles in their own language. The Spirit was so effective that many were converted and believed in the good news of Jesus. So, the Holy Spirit began by enlightening the Apostles and filling them with courage to go out and preach. The same Spirit opened the ears, eyes and minds of those gathered in Jerusalem to embrace the Good News. It was not so much the preaching that won people to Jesus but that the minds of their listeners were opened to the Spirit that lived in the words that they spoke. Becoming temples of the Holy Spirit in baptism means that the Spirit can work through all the baptised to bring people to Jesus. It is the Holy Spirit who brings us together, brings us to God, to Jesus, and to each other, to a place where we know we belong:

For Belonging by John O'Donohue May you listen to your longing to be free. May the frames of your belonging be generous enough for your dreams.

- May you arise each day with a voice of blessing whispering in your heart.
- May you find a harmony between your soul and your life.
- May the sanctuary of your soul never become haunted.
- May you know the eternal longing that lives at the heart of time.
 - May there be kindness in your gaze when you look within.
