**Ramblings** In his Gospel, St John greets us with these words: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God's love for us is so profound that he wanted us to feel and touch his great love in the person of Jesus. This LOVE, however, was so immense that it, too, was given a name, the Holy Spirit! It is impossible to love the Son without loving the Father and the Holy Spirit!

So, what does it mean to believe in God's only Son, to believe in Jesus Christ?

It is not something done with our heads or said with our lips, it is much, much more. It is a belief that recognises Jesus as the source of all life. No Jesus - no life! It recognises that all our gifts, abilities, virtues and talents find their source in Jesus. It recognises that the air we breathe overflows with the presence of God. It recognises the presence of God in everyone - yes everyone and in everything created such that we treat and anything evervone with the reverence, dignity and respect. God said to Moses in the wilderness, "Take off your shoes, the ground you stand upon is Holy!"

God's love is present in every form of true love and especially in the love we have for each other. God's love is expressed in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist which goes far beyond sight and touch. It teaches us the importance and value of spending time in adoration because it helps us become more aware of God's presence everywhere.
