FOCUS OF THE READINGS:

The focus of our readings is the welcome given to the person who brings God's Word.

In the first reading, we have a delightful story about a woman who goes to great efforts to offer hospitality to the prophet Elisha, a holy man of God. Everything was done to make the prophet welcome in their home.

In the Gospel, Jesus says,
"Anyone who welcomes you
welcomes me." He praises those who
welcome the prophets and holy
people.

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

This is a reading from the second book of Kings.

When the prophet Elisha
went to the town of Shunem,
a wealthy woman who lived there
invited him to eat in her home.
After that, whenever Elisha was in that town,
he would stop at her home to eat.
One day the woman said to her husband,

"I can tell that Elisha is a holy man of God. Let's prepare a room upstairs for him. We will put in it a bed, a table, a chair and a lamp. Then, whenever he comes, he can stay there."

The next time Elisha came, he stayed in the room they had prepared for him. He was very grateful for all the kindness the woman had shown him, so he said to his servant Gehazi,

"Is there anything I can do for her?" Gehazi answered,

"Well, she doesn't have any children, and her husband is getting old now."

Elisha said,


"Call her and ask her to come here."

"I promise you that by this time next year, you will have a child."



GOSPEL: Matthew 10:37-42

This is a reading from the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus said to his disciples,

"Anyone who makes you feel welcome, makes me feel welcome.

REFLECTING ON THE READINGS WITH CHILDREN:

The reflections should focus on the various ministers of the Word in the church. Gradually, the children should be led to see that these ministers do the work of Jesus and that when we accept their ministry we are accepting Jesus.

You might begin by suggesting some necessary ministers:

- · catechists,
- ministers of the Word with children,
- · priests,
- those who teach scripture.

How do these people bring God's Word to us? Who are these people in our parish?

Because they bring God's Word to us, we should welcome them. How can we welcome or accept these people who bring God's Word to us? What does Jesus tell us about welcoming these people?

You will also want to encourage the children to reflect on ways in which they, too, are "ministers of the Word." It is our responsibility to be "ministers of the Word" in the way we live. All of the other "ministers" (catechists, priests, and so forth) are there to nourish the community, which is the primary "minister of the Word" in the world. That includes all of us: to serve the poor; to stand up for what is right.
