Ramblings The importance of this celebration is marked by the fact that it has been moved from the Thursday to the Sunday, to enable more people to be blessed with life in this special way. We have little difficulty in believing we are made in the image of God even if we lack understanding or a realisation of what this really means. Although we cannot touch or see love, we can feel its presence as a power that surrounds, fills and overpowers us. When the love of God is given to us in the eucharist, we understand this as God's true presence. Since nothing exists without God's presence, we are not celebrating some past event, or remembering some event that happened some 2000 years ago, but God present, alive and real and full of love. When we experience this presence in the Eucharist, it becomes easier for us to feel and be touched by the presence of the divine in every area of creation: the earth and sky, the trees and plants, the water and the sun, the sea and the wind. All radiating not just the presence of God but God's resplendent love.

Ronald Rolheiser says:

"The Eucharist is not abstract, nor is it a theological instruction, or a creed; neither is it a moral precept or a philosophy, it is not even an intimate word. It is corporeal, it is an embrace, it is a kiss. In fact, it is something shockingly physical. It is the real presence in the deepest possible way."

Another writer wrote:

The reason why I personally prefer to receive the host in my hands is because I feel it takes me closer to how the disciples would have been given the bread 2000 years ago and that long gift of apostolic succession stretches out to me in the here and now. For me Christ is tactile and when I receive the host, I am also able to say "Take my hands and make them as your own".
