**Ramblings** One Transfiguration story deserves another. "There was once a lion that grew up among a flock of sheep and therefore had no awareness that he was a lion. So, he would bleat like a sheep and eat grass like a sheep. One day, while wandering near the edge of the jungle, a mighty lion let out a big roar and leaped out of the forest right into the middle of the flock. All the sheep scattered and ran away. Imagine the surprise of the jungle lion when he saw this other lion there among the sheep. So, he gave chase. He grabbed hold of him. And there was this lion, cringing in front of the king of the jungle. The jungle lion said to him, 'What are you doing here?' And the other lion said, 'Have mercy on me. Don't eat me. Have mercy on me.' But the king of the jungle dragged him away, saying 'Come with me.' And he took him to a lake and he said, 'Look!' So, the lion who thought he was a sheep looked, and for the first time he saw his reflection. He saw his image. Then he looked at the jungle lion, and he looked in the water again, and he let out a mighty roar. He was never a sheep again and it only took an instant." It takes only a moment to wake up to God, only a moment of interior silence, a moment of real prayer, to know deep in our bones our true identity.

John's vision is dazzling, overwhelming, beyond spectacular, obviously an experience beyond words. For a moment, however, rather than focus on Jesus, focus on the apostles. They were able to see Jesus beyond his normal appearance. They experienced his divinity, his graciousness, a power that was all embracing, uplifting, reassuring, full of goodness, love and mercy. What is reassuring is that Jesus shares this divinity, graciousness, this embracing and uplifting power full of goodness, love and mercy with all of us..... Can you see it???


