Prayer for those seeking sanctuary

Lord Jesus, we pray for those members of God's family who come here to escape oppression, poverty, persecution, violence, and war. Let them not meet with fear, doubt or suspicion from the local population. May those seeking sanctuary in our country receive a warm and generous welcome as they settle-in and commence their new life. Joyfully, we welcome the many gifts they bring to us. We make this prayer in Jesus' name. Amen.

Ramblings Responsibilities! Are they are burden or a guide?? Accepting and carrying out our own responsibilities can be hard enough but Jesus says that we are also responsible for the behaviour of others. That is much, much harder. We don't wish to interfere in other people's lives, just as we would not want them to interfere in ours. However, if we see someone harming themselves or moving in that direction, we would want to step in to help them avoid unnecessary hardship and suffering because of our love and concern for their well-being. Parents help their children in this way all the time. It is really a loveresponse filled with a desire to help their child(ren) and find true fulfilment and happiness in life. It would be good then, to realise that Jesus is only asking us to do what we want to do to help others anyway!

Pope Francis emphasises the importance of "fraternal correction" as a "gesture of love for one's brother and sister." This does not mean feeling superior or better, but helping and assisting the other person to overcome their difficulties, shouldering their problem because of weakness or fragility and if your shoulder is not there, (s)he will collapse. To correct means 'to hold with': not to reproach others for their sins but by being their neighbour, to help them overcome their sins, walking together towards healing or towards its beginning. The other will be healed because (s)he has felt your love and has felt a longing to love.

"First of all, I must give them what they need. Immediately. Love them with sincerity and then suffer for the sins they commit. And then pray for them, because prayer makes me God's hand on them, the sign of His fatherly concern through my presence. The Holy Spirit will do the rest."




