## Reflection Wednesday Week 25 St Vincent de Paul 2023

He was born in Aquitaine and became a priest. He devoted his whole life to the service of the poor. He founded a congregation of priests for missionary work, groups of laymen to help paupers and galley-slaves, and, with St Louise de Marillac, the Sisters of Charity.

St Vincent inspired our founder, Emmanuel d'Alzon in his work to help the poor and neglected. In fact, the father of one of his followers played an important role in help found the St Vincent De Paul society. Emmanuel d'Alzon came from one of the richest families in France but chose to live very simply. During his training for the priesthood whenever he looked rather dishevelled his mother would buy him new sets of clothes. A few weeks later his mother saw him wearing the same old clothes and asked why. He replied that others had more need of them than he did.

Even at this early stage in his life he looked on those around him, as Jesus did, seeing them as sheep without a shepherd.

- We should spend as much time in thanking God for his benefits as we do in asking him for them.

- God allows us to give rise to the practice of two beautiful virtues: perseverance, which leads us to attain the goal, and constancy, which helps us to overcome difficulties.
- We must love our neighbour as being made in the image of God and as an object of His love.
