Ramblings Rather than become embroiled in the scheming of Jesus' adversaries, focus on the fact that we are made in the image of God. The God who is the source of all life. The God who is Love in its purest form and know that we are made with and permeated with the love of God. Ronald Rolheiser talks about us being people who promote a culture of life rather than a culture of death. We are given the impression that the Pharisees and Herodians lived a culture of death especially where Jesus was concerned. Cleverly, Jesus uses their challenge to teach us that just as the coin produced had the image of Caesar stamped on it that we are stamped with the image of God who is the source life and the source of love. It is because of this that we belong to God.

John Foley si suggests that, if we are "those things that belong to God", then we "Belong" in a way felt by people who love and are loved. Because of this, we would definitely want to give ourselves to God, and bring our God-filled selves to the secular society within which we live and seek to show everyone around us that Jesus is truly good news. We live in both worlds just as Jesus did. So that rather than either/or we live in both a secular society and the kingdom of God that we know as Church.

We are stamped then with the life, of which God is the source, and with love as well as being gifted with Faith. All three, life, love and faith are lived and experienced, we learn them by living and grow in them through our experiences and attempts to live them better and more fully. 


