Ramblings Challenged by Jesus with the call to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the sick etc. causes us to reflect on ways in which we can do this. Given that most of those in real need live in vast areas of Africa, India and other faraway places, this seems virtually impossible. Rather than say and believe that nothing can be done and give up trying, there is a very positive way we can do something positive here and now. Change your lifestyle and live more simply, reduce your amount of wastage, especially food, do not waste water.

Here in Hitchin, we are doing what Jesus asked. Clothing the naked with mountains of clothes for those seeking sanctuary living among us. The Pantry, Feedup Warmup and the Foodbank all help to provide food for the hungry and we are not alone in this. 
