**Ramblings** Pope Francis: God chose a humble and simple family in which to come into our midst. None of us was born wondrously, with a magic wand. It is beautiful to see Jesus inserted into the fabric of familial affections, which were born and grew in the caresses and concerns of his parents. We come from a story that was woven with bonds of love, and the person we are today was born not so much out of material goods but from the love that we received, from the love in the heart of the family. We may not have been born into an exceptional family without problems, but this is our story — everyone must think: this is my story — these are my roots: if we cut them off, life dries up! God did not create us to be lone rangers, but to walk together. Let us thank him and pray to him for our families. God thinks about us and wants us to be together: grateful, united, capable of preserving our roots. And we have to think about this, about our own story.

## We really need your help to keep the church clean.

Are you looking for a worthy New Year's resolution? How about cleaning the church once a month? We have two vacancies for people to help



keep the church clean. Please let <u>Trish</u> know asap if you can help on a Saturday morning for about an hour.

#### Help needed at 10.30 Mass

We need help in two ways:

① We are in acute need of a person (MC) to help set up for Mass at 10.30am on a Sunday and guide the altar servers - so you would need to be here at 10am. This role will be to support Philippe who is the regular server at this Mass and who works best in a partnership with someone else. Full training and a manual are available to help and if more than one person offered it would not have to be a weekly commitment. Ideally we would love to have 5 people which would cover us for all months including those with 5 Sundays. The commitment then would only be once a month. With the number of people who regularly attend the 10.30 Mass I really hope this will be possible to achieve. Please let Trish know if you are able to help in this way even once a month.

② After the collection is taken at the Mass at the end of Mass we need someone to bag-up the Collection money and put it the safe as the MCs are busy with clearing the church. If you are willing to help with this even occasionally can you speak to Trish please asap.
