Ramblings What's exciting about the Gospel is that the two new followers of Jesus come to him out of a nagging interest; they are not called or chosen, just curious. It could well have been because of the extraordinary stories being told about Jesus and they wanted to come and see for themselves. But rather than them asking questions, Jesus takes the initiative and ask them a question that is often one we ponder. "What are you looking for?"

Only then do they ask, "Where are you staying?" Rather than offer explanations and reasoning, Jesus simply says, "Come and see!"

Jesus comes at Christmas as a new light and, like the followers in the gospel, we are looking for that same light: Jesus.

I cannot tell you how the light comes.

What I know is that it is more ancient than imagining. That it travels across an astounding expanse to reach us.

That it loves searching out what is hidden, what is lost, what is forgotten or in peril, or in pain.

That it has a fondness for the body, for finding its way toward flesh, for tracing the edges of form, for shining forth through the eye, the hand, the heart. I cannot tell you how the light comes, but that it does.

That it will. That it works its way into the deepest dark that enfolds you, though it may seem long ages in coming or arrive in a shape you did not foresee.

And so may we this day turn ourselves toward it. May we lift our faces to let it find us.

May we bend our bodies to follow the arc it makes. May we open and open more and open still to the blessed light that comes. Jesus Christ!

18th-25th Jan Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2024

This international Week of Prayer starts on the 18th January. The theme this year, proposed by the churches of Burkina Faso, is You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself, based on the story of the Good Samaritan.

"We have been invited to live the divine call to love God and our neighbour as ourselves," reads one prayer of intercession. "As we renew our commitment to this call, may this love strengthen our unity as Christians." There will be a pulpit exchange in that week. There won't be an extra joint service on the Sunday afternoon, but everyone is invited to St. Mark's Taize service at 4pm on **Sunday 28**th **January** on the theme of the week, using music and reflections in the style of the Taize ecumenical community in France. All are welcome to come along to this and stay for the refreshments afterwards.
