Ramblings At the conclusion Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy a few years ago, Pope Francis set up "a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so we could appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people". He wanted the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches. This was to be on the 3rd Sunday of the year. This Sunday therefore we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. The celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God (this Sunday) has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity. In Hitchin we exchange pulpits. The week of prayer for Christian Unity begins on 18th January each year.

The various communities are invited to find their own ways to mark this Sunday with a certain solemnity. It is important, therefore, that in the Eucharistic celebration the sacred text be enthroned, in order to focus the attention of the assembly on the normative value of God's word. On this Sunday, it would be particularly appropriate to highlight the proclamation of the word of the Lord and to emphasize in the homily the honour that it is due. Renewed efforts should be made to provide members of the faithful with the training needed to be genuine proclaimers of the word, as in the case of acolytes or extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Pastors could also find ways of giving a Bible, or one of its books, to the entire assembly as a way of showing the importance of learning how to read, appreciate and pray daily with sacred Scripture, especially through the practice of lectio divina.' (Aperuit Illis)
