#### Prayer for those seeking sanctuary

**Ramblings** We live in a time when people are becoming disillusioned with politics politicians only seem to fight over who should govern the country; it is a fight for power not the common good. The wars in Ukraine and Gaza are horrendous and are worsening. Our time cries out loudly for a transfiguration as a sign of hope that love of neighbour will become the foremost thought in everyone's mind, most especially world leaders and leaders of countries. In response Pope Francis has called the coming Jubilee Year in 2025 a year of HOPE; and don't we need it! Transfiguration is not just about seeing things differently; it is about seeing the true identity and reality of what we are doing to ourselves. In that light-transforming moment on Mount Tabor, Peter James and John saw Jesus completely differently, as someone filled with the light of the Divine; something impossible to put into words.

St John of Damascus wrote:

Christ is transfigured, not by putting on some quality He did not possess previously, nor by changing into something He never was before, but by revealing to His disciples what He truly was, in opening their eyes and in giving sight to those who were blind. For while remaining identical to what He had been before. He appeared to the disciples in His splendour; He is indeed the true light, the radiance of glory.

The transfiguration invites us to look more carefully at those around us in an effort to look beyond the familiar image we have of them to something far deeper yet hidden from us; the glory of the Divine living within them. In this way what we see in them will transform our understanding of their lives and also of ours. What we see in others is always a reflection of what lies within us; this applies both to goodness as well as faults and failings!



Monday 25<sup>th</sup> March 7.30pm Passover Meal in the Church Hall. To celebrate Passover is to do what Jesus did with his disciples at the Last Supper. It is a chance for

us to understand more deeply our Jewish roots and our Christian Eucharist. The Passover Meal is a family occasion and children form an integral part of the proceedings, so all are very welcome. You need to bring a number of things with you: a baked potato for each person, cooked and wrapped in foil (to keep warm), sufficient wine for 4 toasts, soft drinks/water, cutlery, plates and glasses for each person. Roast lamb is provided. (You can bring salad and toppings for the potatoes as well – to share with those around you, if you wish.)

It is a wonderful way to begin Holy Week. All ages welcome. Please sign up on the board in the porch as we need to know numbers by 18<sup>th</sup> March so that we can order the meat.

We have been asked as a deanery to consider the following questions for a deanery meeting in March:

- How do we witness as a Parish and proclaim our faith to:
  - a. those who have never heard of Christ
  - b. those who have ceased walking with Christ
  - c. those with whom we Christ (those who go to church)?
- 2. How should we organise ourselves as a parish to do this more effectively?
- 3. What concrete steps / formation opportunities would help us begin to witness and proclaim our faith more effectively?
- 4. What structures may need to change? How might we need to develop the way we are organised currently?

We also would like representatives from our parish to take our responses to a meeting on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> March at 7pm at St Hilda's in Stevenage. Two representatives from that meeting (involving all the parishes) will then be asked to attend the Dean's meeting on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March.

# Two messages from our new Sacramental co-ordinator Ciara O'Reilly.

①Applications for the Confirmation 2024 programme are now open. Young people who are in Year 9 and above are invited to apply to take part in the Confirmation Programme this year. The purpose of the programme is to provide young people with a time of formation and discernment so that at the end of the programme they can decide for themselves whether or not they want to be confirmed members of the Catholic Church.

This programme will begin with an induction session on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at the Church. The session will begin with Mass at 18:30 and finish by 20:30 (timings will be confirmed closer to the date).

The induction session, as all other sessions, are mandatory to complete the programme as it is not possible for a young person to 'catch up' at home if sessions are missed. Sessions will take place on a Tuesday evening. The full timetable of sessions will be released within the next fortnight.

If at any point during the Confirmation Programme your young person decides that they do not wish to be confirmed that is absolutely fine. Confirmation is a personal choice and should be received free from any pressure.

If there is a young person in your household who wishes to be part of the Confirmation Programme for 2024 please click on Confirmation and download, complete and return the application form to Ciara by email or bringing it to the Parish Office, by Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2024. Please note: as part of the application process, you will need to provide a copy of your Baptism Certificate if you were not baptised here at Our Lady's.

The Confirmation programme aims to provide a space for the candidates to explore and challenge their faith in a safe environment. This is done by following the Sycamore series; the format of this is a short video on an aspect of the Catholic faith and has three elements throughout: input, discussion and views. The input is by Fr Stephen Wang a Catholic Priest of our diocese who is Rector of the Venerable English College in Rome. After a time of input, the candidates are posed a question for discussion. They spend time discussing the issue in pods with their catechist(s). The catechist is there to encourage discussion and offer their thoughts as another person also on a faith journey.

vital role offers you the opportunity to inspire and guide our youth on their journey of faith as they prepare to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

# UNIVERSITYOF Participate in BIRMINGHAM Our Research Project
